Human trafficking can happen anywhere, but transportation hubs such as airports, bus stations, truck stops, and travel centers are particularly vulnerable. Though the crime doesn't always require a border crossing or act of movement, traffickers often take advantage of America's transportation infrastructure to exploit their victims and hide them in plain sight. Members of the traveling public are in a unique position to recognize and report potential human trafficking situations. If you plan on traveling this summer, be sure to check out the resources offered by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) Blue Campaign. Your awareness *could* save a life.

Responding to the End of Title 42

May 11 was the final day for the Trump and Biden administrations' "Title 42" policy, which overturned the basic right to seek asylum at the U.S.-Mexico border for 38 months. Now, the U.S. government is reverting to immigration law, Title 8. Since December, Abbott's office said Texas had transported over 15,000 people to Washington, New York, Chicago, and Philadelphia. There is anticipation of a new wave of migration at the border, with headlines proclaiming that officials are "bracing for an influx."

In Maryland, we have not witnessed this influx but there is an increased possibility of asylum seekers coming to Maryland seeking shelter and additional services

Maryland Cannabis Reform

Effective July 1, 2023, the Maryland General Assembly enacted HB 556 and SB 516 which established a regulatory framework for individuals 21+ years old to purchase and possess regulated cannabis and cannabis products in Maryland (Use this <u>resource</u> to learn more about the newly passed law). The Maryland Cannabis Administration (MCA), formerly the Maryland Medical Cannabis Commission (MMCC), has been providing this important information to law enforcement for situational awareness and planning purposes. The MCA has notified law enforcement in anticipation of large volumes of vehicular and pedestrian traffic in and around cannabis dispensaries throughout the State. Law enforcement is on alert for these potential issues and will plan accordingly. The MCA has personnel deployed throughout the State conducting random regulatory compliance checks at dispensaries throughout the first week of adult-use sales; however, dispensary licensees are advised to contact law enforcement with concerns relating to vehicular or pedestrian traffic, disorderly individuals, and any other concern outside of MCA's regulatory authority. Funding Opportunities

The Green and Resilient Retrofit Program (GRRP)

This program provides funding for direct loans and grants to fund projects that improve energy or water efficiency, enhance indoor air quality or sustainability, implement the use of zero-emission electricity generation, low-emission building materials or processes, energy storage, or building electrification strategies, or address climate resilience, of eligible HUD-assisted multifamily properties.

The Elements NOFO provides funding for owners to include proven and meaningful climate resilience and utility efficiency measures in projects that are already in the process of a recapitalization transaction.

 Examples of eligible Elements investments include, but are not limited to, installation of electric HVAC heat pumps, Energy Star windows, fire resistant roofs and clean energy generation systems. HUD expects to make approximately 200 awards with \$140 million in funding The Leading Edge NOFO offers funding to building owners who want to quickly achieve ambitious goals for reducing carbon emissions, using renewable energy, and making their buildings more resilient to climate change. They don't need much help from HUD (a government agency) for technical assistance.

The Comprehensive NOFO provides funding to start renovation projects from the beginning, focusing on energy efficiency, reducing greenhouse gas emissions, creating green and healthy housing, using renewable energy, and making the buildings more resilient to climate impacts. These awards are for a wide range of properties, including those without existing renovation plans.

The Homelessness Solutions Program (HSP)

The Homelessness Solutions Program (HSP) is a Maryland program that helps address homelessness. It provides funding and support to organizations called Continuums of Care (CoCs) and Local Homeless Coalitions (LHCs), which coordinate resources and funding for service providers across the state.

The program has a Policy Guide that gives directions to organizations that receive funding (grantees) on what they can do with the money. It also provides a Quick Reference Guide that shows the activities they can use the money for. The program

also has a checklist to make sure organizations are spending the money properly and providing the right documentation.

Lead agencies of the 16 CoCs and LHCs can apply for HSP funding on behalf of homeless service providers in their community. The funding can be used for various services and activities to help the homeless, like street outreach, emergency shelter, helping people find housing quickly (rapid rehousing), preventing homelessness, case management, and administrative costs.
